Your Fishing Report

With a warming trend starting this weekend we expect fishing to pick up from fair to good. Spring is in the air and the fish have been moving into the mouths of the deeper bays to find the warmer water temps.

Lake Conditions Water Clarity and Temperature ...

Both lakes range from dingy in some of the creeks with the main lake and larger bays clearing. Surface water temps on both lakes are around 46 degrees and warming to the

high 40's in the afternoons on sunny days. With the amount of rainfall we had this week expect the TVA to pull lake levels down a foot, from 1-1/2 feet above winter pool to 1/2 foot above winter pool.

Crappies:

The KNB pontoon has been spider rigging jigs tipped with Crappie nibbles this week. We have concentrated our efforts in the deeper bays with 10 to 15 feet of water. Biggest Crappies have been just off bottom but some have been suspending up a few feet. We also had a big Yellow Perch as a bonus...and of course a few Yellowbass and the daily Drum! Best colors have been Magic Shad and Electric Chicken fished on a 1/16th ounce light wire jig from Ken's TBC. I like the light wire hooks because they straighten out to free your jig from



obstructions and just bend back to normal. Best speed for us has been 3.5 mph. The sunnier days have seemed to produce better I believe because of the warming water temp. Water temp has ranged from 46.5 to 49.5 degrees. Changing jig body colors is a necessity to find the right colors at the right times.



Largemouth Bass:

Largemouth Bass are being taken mainly on sharp dropping main lake points and the deeper secondary points. Jerk baits, fished slow have caught some monsters but the bite has been sporadic. Points where the sun has been hitting all day warm up faster and the fish have been more active there. Bama rigs, crawfish jigs and Carolina rigged creature baits and shaky head worms fished slow has caused some reaction bites also. Ledges have been okay on some of the cloudy days.

Other Species

Haven't fished for other species yet this year, but have seen pics of big cats from above and below Kentucky dam.
