Heavy rainfall has dumped from three to five inches of rain across the Tennessee and Cumberland River valley over the last several days. Both lakes are receiving an influx of water and projection over the next several days is that lake levels could raise as much as Two Feet **ABOVE SUMMER POOL**.

Lake Conditions

Lake Levels ... As of this morning both lakes are on the brink of **SUMMER POOL.** The Dams are spilling so there is a significant amount of current in the lake.

Boaters – With the Dams spilling there is significant current in the lake so be cautious and by all means keep a safe distance from the Dams also keep an eye out for floating debris.

Water Conditions ... **Barkley** - main lake is very stained and quite a few of the bays and feeder creeks are muddy. **Kentucky** - main lake is cloudy with some of the bays being stained. Some of the major bays that have multiple creeks feeding the area are a more stained.

Water Temps ... Surface temps on both lakes are in the low to mid 50's

Weather Outlook

Thursday... Mostly sunny. Highs in the lower 40s. West winds 5 mph in the morning shifting to the south in the afternoon.

Thursday Night... Mostly clear. Lows in the upper 20s. Southwest winds 5 mph.

Fishing Report



Bass Fishing ... It's been windy, rainy and cold and the lake levels are rising but the bass are still biting. Some fish are still relatively shallow and others are on the first drop beginning their late fall migration back to deeper water. With the wind and current, staying on the fish has been a challenge at times but when you found them they have been very catchable and some were pretty decent too. Lake Current Dictates Fish Location.

The Dams are spilling and the lakes have a significant amount of current. Fish can be located in one spot today and gone tomorrow, leaving us scratching our heads in confusion but Main lake points and points at the mouth of the bays are a good choice right now as the current is dictating fish location. Some bass have

been taken near creek channel at the mouth of the bays or on long tapering gravel points on **Steel Shad** blade baits. The best colors have been Silver and Gold with a slow, stop and go retrieve working the best. The most dependable method for finding fish has been to start at the mouth of the bay and work the creek channel paying special attention to where the channel intersects with the main lake point. With the cooler weather some fish have backed away from the bank and are suspending on the first drop where the point transitions into deeper water. The best fishing has come during the prime feeding times. Prime Feeding Times are golden this time of year.

Crappie ... Unfortunately the really bad weather lately has hampered crappie fishing but when we able to get on the water it was pretty good. Crappie are being caught over brush about 10 feet deep with minnows on a slip bobber rig or casting 3/32 oz KY Green or Blue Pearl curly tails. A lot of non-keeper fish were caught but if you were patient enough to work thru the shorts by the end of the day you were rewarded with some good ones. I believe that the upcoming spring crappie season will be one of the better ones in recent memory and I can't wait! BOOK NOW and get the dates you want!

fish slowed quite a bit this week. While we weren't focusing on these species specifically, we caught a few crappie fishing.

Sonar Tip of the Week



The screen shows a school of bass on the drop side of a secondary Ledge. In late November and early December a good number of baitfish and bass begin their late fall early winter migration returning to deeper water. While this screen shot was taken in early September you can bet that this same spot will harbor bass in early winter when the reverse migration begins. The Lowrance HDS 10 was used to pinpoint the location of the school and identified how deep they were.
