Lake Levels ... As of this morning both lakes were approximately 2.75 feet below summer pool. Until we receive additional water from the south or a local rainfall it appears we'll be under lower than normal summer pool levels. 
Pontoon Fishing Is Fun!!!

Fishing Report

Largemouth Bass ... This has been another great week of bass fishing for Kick'n Bass clients, both for numbers and size. Some of the bigger fish are off the bed and on the move and are beginning to show up on the main lake ledges and the mouth of the bays are producing. As always this time of year you can catch some fish shallow but with all the tournaments and pre-tournament practice going on the shallows are getting crowded. Our plan was to go offshore and it has really paid off with some really nice catches. Best lures have been SPRO crankbaits, Steel Shad blade baits and Shakey Heads using Zman finesse worms on 3/16 oz. PJ's bass extractor jigs. On cloudy days the Gold Steel Shad was boss and several really nice bass were caught yo-yoing the lure in 10 to 15 feet of water on long tapering points at the mouth of the bays. Mid-week the lake levels dropped a bit and with minimal current the fish were finicky. To increase our odds we adjusted our presentation to include Zman 4" finesse worms and drug them thru the shell beds on a PJ's 3/16 oz. Bass Extractor jig. Some of our biggest bass were

caught on the smaller worms. Best colors were Pumpkin Green Flake, Coppertruese and June Bug. **Smallmouth Bass** ... we caught several smallmouth in the shell beds on the shakey head but overall the best fish were caught on jigs off main lake points at the mouth of the bays. While the smallmouth, number-wise, was a minority in our bass catch the average size was pretty good being between 3-4 pounds. These fighters were tail walkers and didn't appreciate being hooked at all.



Crappie fishing ... Most were caught while we were Redear and Bluegill fishing and were black crappie in water 6 feet or less. It's important to remember that Black Crappie will hang around the spawning flats for several weeks before they migrate to deeper water. We found clusters of fish on submerged structure that was located on the first drop adjacent to the spawning flats. Also I observed the KDFWR this week electroshocking and

they were sampling a lot of fish including a big number of crappie. So there is a BIG number of fish still shallow and waiting to be caught.

Bluegill & Redear ... Another great week of Panfishing! We had a lot of fun watching our clients catch these fighting fish. We've used several methods to catch them including a slip float presentation with live bait and slow rolling a Ken's or Shelton's bluegill bug tipped with a cricket or a wax or red worm. Look for chunk rock banks with rocks the size of a coffee can among brown gravel. The sandier the gravel the better. If you're having a difficult time locating them just think a little deeper.

Sonar Tip of the Week



These bass beds were discovered during an on the water sonar class with Bruce Winters of Chicago, Ill. The old road bed adjoins a gravel bar making it an ideal spawning location and the beds were easy to spot. We caught several bass including one big female from this spot. All bass were released immediately and unharmed. Your system can do this too.
