## Lake Conditions

**Lake Levels ...** As of this morning both lakes are approximately 1.5 feet above winter pool. The gates are spilling at both Barkley & Kentucky creating significant current in the upper lake. For additional info, including generation schedule for Kentucky Lake, visit the TVA website:

**Water Clarity and Temperature ...** Kentucky Lake ranges from heavy stain in some of the creeks to the main lake dingy. Barkley is heavily stained to muddy in the creeks and bays and the main lake is dingy to muddy. Surface water temps on both lakes are in the mid 40's. Always wear your PFD and keep an extra change of clothes on board. Advise others of your fishing plans.

## Fishing Report

**Bass Fishing** ... Prior to the inclement and extremely wet weather bass fishing was very good on A-Rigs and Steel Shad blade baits at the mouth of the bays and along the main river channel ledges. Most fish were suspended 15 foot deep in 20-25 feet of water and chasing shad. Use your High Definition Sonar to locate the fish, scroll to where they are on the screen and then mark the depth they're holding at. Cast your lure and count it down and run your lure thru the strike zone. Sounds easy, right? It's never that easy but it will work!

**Crappie Fishing** ... was fair to good over submerged cover and along secondary ledges. Best areas seem to be the deeper ledges and brush piles and jigs and minnows were both productive.

**Important Lake Conditions** ... This week there has been as many as 19 gates open at Kentucky Dam spilling excess water coming in from the south. Barkley has multiple gates open also. Once the gates are closed and the lake retreats to more normal levels for this time of year, I would expect fishing to pick up right up where it left off and be pretty good. My guess is if we don't get any inclement wet weather, or excess water from the south, things will be looking pretty good by Monday.
