Lake Conditions

Lake Levels ... As of this morning both lakes are approximately 1 foot over pool and on a steady rise. With the abnormal amount of rain fall in the Ohio and Mississippi River basins expect TVA to hold releasing any significant amount of water downstream over the next several days. Water Clarity and Temperature ... Kentucky Lake ranges from stained in the back of the bays to the main lake clearing. Barkley is slightly stained in the creeks and bays and the main lake is murky. Surface water temps are in the 64 degree range with the back of the bays warmer.

Friday...Partly sunny. Highs in the upper 60s. Southeast winds around 5 mph.

Friday Night...Showers likely. Lows around 50. Southeast winds around 5 mph. Chance of precipitation 70 percent.

Saturday...Mostly cloudy with a 50 percent chance of showers. Highs in the mid 60s. East winds around 5 mph.

Fishing Report

Crappie Fishing – WOW! We've had some really great crappie trips this week and some clients have caught some really nice fish. The black males have been aggressively preparing the spawning sites and have been caught in water 3-5 feet. The Black Females are being caught in staging areas adjacent to the spawning flats. Some white crappie are being caught shallow but primarily those are males. The big females are still in transition and are on the move and are holding along creek channels and transition ledges. Our clients

have caught most fish casting KY Green curly tails with Ken's Blue Pearl and Lime Green Light Wire lead heads. The light wire lead heads enable you to fish submerged cover without the fear of getting hung up. If you do hang up a steady but gentle pull usually dislodges the lure and sometimes when this happens you'll get bit, this has happened several times. I'd rate the crappie fishing very good and getting better. Some clients would say that it couldn't get any better but I know it can!

Catch Fish & Have Fun on the Kick'n Bass Pontoon!





Decent numbers of crappie continue to be caught on from the *Kick'n Bass Pontoon* while fishing the flats in the bays using 1/16 oz jigs and double minnow rigs. Both White & Black Crappie are being caught and spider rigging or long line trolling are the best methods. Currently with the crappie in transition to and from the spawning flats, the chances are good that you'll catch some nice fish. Everyone is having a blast on the pontoon just check out the smiling faces in the photos. What's nice about this type of fishing is you can go as a group and have a good time at a leisurely pace. The pontoon can fish up to 6 anglers. The Big Female was caught on a PJ's Bass Extractor jig and ZMan Super Finesse worm fished Shakey Head style. The bass was photographed and released unharmed.

Bass Fishing ... Typical for this time of year a lot of patterns and techniques are coming on. The backs of the bays have been holding fish. With the water above summer pool the fish have been at the base of the bushes. We've used a ZMan Plum Sawtail worm to flip or pitch the bushes to catch some really nice fish. The long slender profile on the worm slithers between the branches and gets down where the big ones are. We're pegging the ¼ oz. sinker to the worm. Casting an unweighted ZMan ZinkerZ infront of the bushes has been a real hot way to fish too. The ZinkerZ fishes like a Senko but with the ElaZtech material it doesn't tear. With rising water, the full moon and warmer temps the females are staging on the

spawning flats where they can be caught on lipless crank baits and Steel Shad bade baits. Best colors on the Steel Shad are Silver on sunny days and Gold on cloudy days. The Steel Shad has just the right profile to mimic a shad which is what the bass are feeding on. Also the yellow flowers are holding some bass and a ZMan Chatter Bait has caught some nice fish. We've caught both largemouth and small mouth on Curly Tail grubs and Steel Shad Blade baits working gravel bars and chunk rock banks. If you like numbers there are tons of 12-15 inch male bass prowling the flats as the big females are moving in to spawn. Expect the first major spawn of the year to kick into high gear within days.

SONAR TIP OF THE WEEK ...



We've been following the crappie migration for several weeks now. One thing that has been readily apparent is they've been using underwater ledges that tie into pea gravel flats as a conduit to make their way to prime spawning areas. Once we found the crappie staging on the ledges we used a Steel Shad blade bait, which emulated a baitfish nicely and stayed in the strike zone, to catch some really nice fish. Without our Lowrance HDS system no way would we have ever found schools like this. Your system can get images like this too!
