#### **Lake Conditions**

**Water Clarity and Temperature ...** on Kentucky Lake ranges from light stain in some of the creeks with the main lake very clear. The lake is very fishable. Barkley is lightly stained and the main lake is very fishable. Surface water temps on both lakes are in the mid 40's.

## Weather Outlook - Winter Storm Warning!

## **Fishing Report**

This will be an abbreviated fishing report due to the Winter Storm Warning and unsettling weather. Currently Kentucky Dam has 2 gates open and this is creating significantly more current in the upper lake. With the gates open at the Dam expect the water to start to have a tad more color to it. And this is probably a good thing.

**Crappie Fishing ...** The very clear water has hampered crappie fishing over brush somewhat. The fish have been somewhat spooky at times and catching multiple fish from a single brush pile has been difficult. The best plan has been to move from one brush pile to another rather than to try and wait things out. Best depths have been 12-15 feet and minnows cast on a slip bobber rig has out produced casting a jig. My suggestion is to scan the brush piles and once you find a productive one, mark it with a buoy and go find another and mark it too. Go back to the first pile and back off and cast your slip bobber rigs and minnows. Be Patient it's a slow bite.

**Bass Fishing** ... We've managed to catch a few fish either throwing an Alabama rig on a slow retrieve or fishing a Jerk Bait very slowly. Best Jerk Bait has been the SPRO McStick. Fish the main lake points at the mouth of the bays and use a long pause between jerks.

**Stripes & Yellows ...** Use a Steel Shad or a Dixie Jet Spoon around the mouth of the bays. Look for the gulls circling and most likely you find a big school mauling shad.

Once we get past the inclement weather the fish will get more into their winter feeding habits and will be easier to pattern.

Locating your LSS Transducer (StructureScan transducer) in the proper location is critical if you want to achieve peak performance from your system. In this case the transducer was mounted on the left side of the jack plate resulting in a loss of about 40% view on the right side. Unfortunately I see this scenario way too often. The first step in our "On the Water Sonar Class" is to inspect your system to see if the installation has been done to factory specs and the components are installed in the proper location. If adjustments are needed we make them prior to beginning your class. Doing so assures you that your system will perform at a high level and you'll get the most out of our time on the water.
