Lake Conditions – Early this morning the boat ramps located here on the North end were still iced in. Also the bays have a significant amount of ice in them. If you are able to launch and decide venture out do so at your own risk and proceed with caution. Remember, always wear your PFD and advise others of your plans.

Lake Levels ... As of this morning both lakes are a approximately one foot above winter pool. For additional info, including generation schedule for Kentucky Lake, visit the TVA website: http://www.tva.gov/lakes/kyh r.htm There are multiple number of gates open at the Dams creating significant current in the main lake and below the Dams. Proceed with caution.

Water Clarity and Temperature ... Kentucky Lake ranges from stain in some of the creeks with the main lake color varying from clear to murky. Barkley is stained and the main lake is murky. Surface water temps on both lakes are around 40 degrees.

Friday...Mostly cloudy with a 30 percent chance of rain. Highs in the lower 50s. South winds 10 to 15 mph.

Friday Night...Rain. Lows in the mid 40s. South winds 10 to 15 mph. Chance of precipitation near 100 percent.
