Lake Conditions

Lake Levels ... As of this morning both lakes are a approximately one foot above winter pool. For additional info, including generation schedule for Kentucky Lake, visit the TVA website: http://www.tva.gov/lakes/kyh_r.htm **There are multiple number of gates open at the Dams creating significant current in the main lake and below the Dams. Proceed with caution.**

Water Clarity and Temperature ... Kentucky Lake ranges from stain in some of the creeks with the main lake color varying from clear to murky. Barkley is stained and the main lake is murky. Surface water temps on both lakes are around 40 degrees.

Weather Outlook

Friday... Cloudy. Scattered flurries. Highs in the upper 20s. West winds 10 to 20 mph.

Thursday... Partly cloudy. Highs in the mid 30s. Lows in the lower 20s.

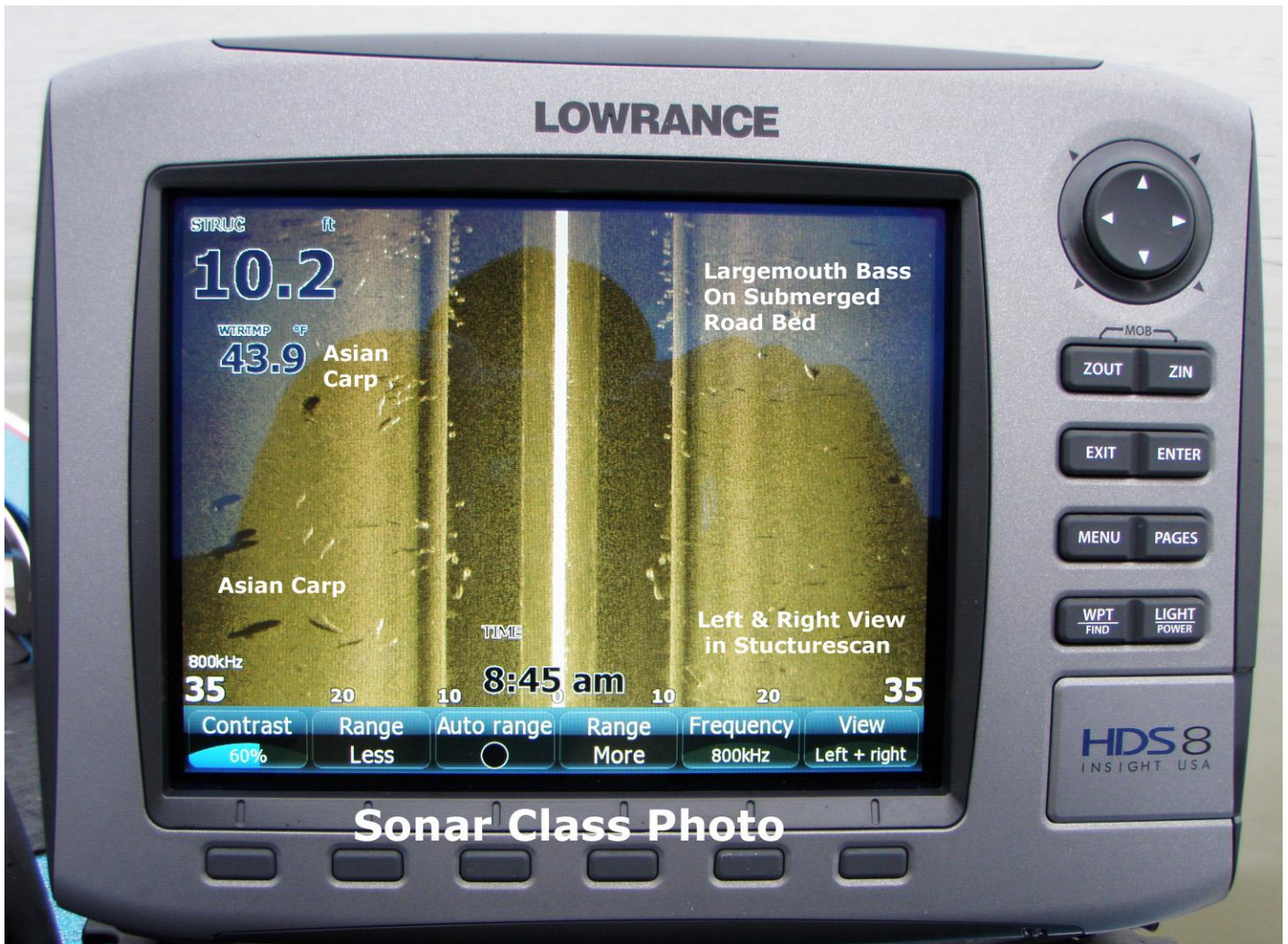
