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# Lake Conditions – Note: Kentucky Dam will be spilling until further notice.

**Lake Levels ...** Looking at the indicators at my dock here on Malcolm creek it appears that we are about 2 ½ feet over summer pool. The rise, has been aided by the torrential rain we had which added some color to the back of the bays and creeks. Additionally we're having a significant amount of water entering the reservoir from the south so expect the gates at the Dam to be open for a period of time to adjust for the influx of water. This will increase the amount of current in the lake. There is some floating debris on the lakes so boat with caution. **Water Clarity and Temperature** ... **Kentucky Lake** ranges from stain in some of the creeks and bays with the main lake color clear to slightly murky. **Barkley Lake** ... the main lake is stained and the creeks and bays stained to muddy due to the run off from recent rains. There is some floating debris on the lake so boat with caution. The Lowrance temperature probe on my Ranger showed water temps ranging from 66 degrees on the main lake and 68 in the bays.

#### **Weather Outlook**

**Friday**...Mostly cloudy with a 30 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Highs in the lower 60s. Southeast winds 5 to 10 mph.

**Friday Night**...Showers and thunderstorms likely. Lows in the mid 50s. Southeast winds 5 to 10 mph. Chance of precipitation 70 percent.

**Saturday**...Showers likely and a chance of thunderstorms in the morning...Then showers and thunderstorms likely in the afternoon. Highs in the mid 70s. Chance of precipitation 70 percent.

## Fishing Report





Bass Fishing ... bass are in basically three phases right now ... pre-spawn, spawn and post spawn depending on which section of the lake you're fishing. Here on the North end, while a lot of smaller males are being caught shallow on crank baits both lipless and square bill, some anglers are catching big females fish like the ones Gene Huber (left) and Matt Quinn (right) caught. With the rising water levels a good number of fish are in the bushes setting up for the spawn. Others are staging

on main lake and secondary points near the spawning flats. The best method seems to be working a weightless senko type bait or crawling a 7 – 9" plastic worm in the back of the bays until you feel submerged cover and either let the lure sit or shake it ever so lightly to entice a strike. Another hot spot is any drainage near a ridge or bank, try working your favorite plastic there ... using a lighter weight and a slow fall seems to entice more strikes. Post spawners, bloody tails and all, that haven't made it out to the ledges yet are beginning to show up out on the main lake points. **Main Lake ...** With the water up and lots of current on the main lake, baitfish are eddying up on main lake points and a Steel Shad Blade Bait on a medium to slow retrieve is a real good choice. We're catching both Largemouth and Smallmouth with some white bass mixed in. Best colors are Silver on sunny days and Gold on cloudy days. The Steel Shad has just fish the right profile to mimic a shad, which is what the post spawn bass are feeding on. Think no rattle and good vibration on a medium slow retrieve

**Crappie** ... We've had mixed results on crappie this week again but what I can tell you is while at times the numbers have been down we have caught some monster fish. With the water on



the rise the black crappie have scattered but the whites that haven't spawned are suspending off the points in the bays. On cloudy days our best results have come by abandoning the suspended fish and concentrating on sandy gravel banks in search of shallow fish. Basically we're casting the banks using a KY Green Curly tail on a 3/32 Ken's light wire leadhead. We use a crappie nibble if the bite is slow. Fair numbers but really big fish

**Kick'n Bass Pontoon Fishing** ... The results have been about the same from the pontoon. Mixed results number wise but really big fish. Trolling cranks is beginning to be a factor of the points and ledges where some big whites and blacks are being caught. This

best bite seems to be best on sunny days. This is a really cool way to fish and have fun!
