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Lake Conditions

Water Clarity and Temperature ... Both lakes have what I would consider as ideal water clarity for fishing. The Lowrance temperature probe on my Ranger showed water temps ranging from 80 degrees on the main lake and 83 in the bays with water warming in the afternoon on sunny days.

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Fishing Report





Kick'n Bass and Chuck Juengling (L) from Louisville with a couple of nice Shakey Head bass caught this week fishing offshore.

Bass Fishing ... I'm sounding like a broken record here but Offshore fishing has been inconsistently good for us. What I mean by that is when we've been able to zero in on fish we have caught good numbers of better than average size fish. However, when it's been slow it has been just that. One thing we picked up on this week is the late spawners from the full moon on the 2nd are off bed and gravitating to the ledges. This week we caught several 4 pound post spawn females that were showing obvious signs of the spawn. Again we have employed the freestyle jig and swim bait combo and the Shakey Head to catch most of our fish with the Steel Shad blade bait starting to come into it's own when we find the bass schooled up and suspended off the ledges.

ZMan finesse worms fished Shakey Head style using a PJ's Bass extractor Jig with a special wire keeper to keep the worm snug against the jig head has been an absolute killer for numbers of fish on the ledges. We used Shimano Crucial & Cumara Shakey Head rods and Shimano ci4 reels spooled with Power Pro yellow 10lb. braid and a 10lb 100% fluorocarbon leader. This set up gives you the feel, cast ability and strength without the weight to fish all day long and fight some real good fish. Besides, it's just plain fun to fish this way. If you haven't tried this combination then you don't know what you're missing. If you're in the KY Lakes area see Rhonda at Bass & Gas on Hwy 68 and she'll show you the right equipment. Carolina rigged lizards and slow rolling 8" swim baits on main lake ledges has produced some fish.

Stripes (White Bass & Yellows)

White bass are beginning to show up in decent numbers and Yellows are too. And they're mixed in with some nice cats too! Casting a **Steel Shad Blade Bait** has been our best bet on the ledges where we're finding decent schools of whites suspending off the main drops in 12-18 feet of water. Try ripping the bait off the bottom and them abruptly stop it and let if flutter to the bottom. Some of our best catches have been on the fall.



Bluegill & Redear Fishing ... Fishing for both species has been fair this week. Best methods have been using Shelton's Bluegill bug with and without a cricket and fishing a cricket under an ESB slip bobber was a strong second. The Redear seem to be bedding slightly deeper than last year and aren't as plentiful so if you don't find them real shallow keep this in mind.

Crappie Fishing ... Mixed results number wise but really big fish. Trolling cranks is beginning to be a serious factor off the points and ledges where some big whites and blacks are being caught. This best bite seems to be best on sunny days. This is a really cool way to fish and have fun. (*Photo*) Coltin Floyd, 12 from Louisville with his Big Crappie. Nice catch young man!

Catfish ... catfishing is the best it's been in years for sure and on just about any live bait you want to use. A big juicy nite crawler would be my choice but a lot of the bait shops have a great assortment of catfish baits and tackle. Captain Rich has been loading the boat all week and some BIG ONES too!

Within minutes I was on the spot, had marked some fish on structure and took two bass off the structure in the first 3 casts. By my estimation I had been 4.1 miles away less then 15 minutes earlier looking at a portion of KY Lake I had never fished in my lifetime. To have found and caught these fish prior to Monday would have taken me hours and good fortune. Big thank you to Randy and the crew over at Bass & Gas for a job well done.
