Lake Conditions

Lake Levels ... Stable at summer pool. However, this could change with the predicted rainfall amounts we've had and are projected to receive in the next few days. For additional info, including generation schedule for Kentucky Lake, visit the TVA website:

Water Clarity and Temperature ... Both lakes have what I would consider as ideal water clarity for fishing. The Lowrance temperature probe on my Ranger showed water temps ranging from 83 degrees on the main lake and 85 in the bays with water warming in the afternoon on sunny days.

Weather Outlook

Friday...Partly sunny with a 50 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Highs in the upper 80s. Southwest winds 5 to 10 mph.

Monday...Partly sunny with a 50 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Highs in the lower 80s.

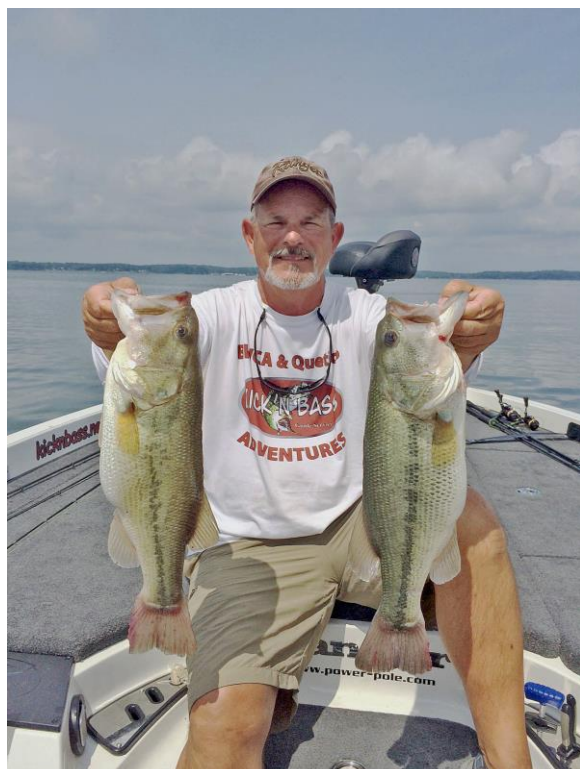
Monday Night...Partly cloudy with a 50 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Lows in the upper 60s.

Fishing Report

Kick'n Bass with a couple of post spawn females caught fishing offshore.

Bass Fishing ... The hotter the weather the better the fishing is ... so it seems. I can tell you this, it's a lot harder on my clients and me than it is the fish that's for certain. Our best bite has come during the afternoon feeding times, which has overlapped with peak current generation. Pay attention to the Prime feeding times found here in this report and plan your fishing to correspond with them. I think you'll find the fish to be more active during that period. Most of our fish have been caught on either a freestyle football jig and ZMan SwimmerZ swim bait combo or a Shakey Head. The Steel Shad blade bait has been a good plan to catch the aggressive fish when we find them schooled up and suspended off the ledges.

ZMan finesse worms fished Shakey Head style using a PJ's Bass extractor Jig with a special wire keeper to keep the worm snug against the jig head has been an absolute killer for numbers of fish on the ledges but our biggest fish have come off the Freestyle Football head and ZMan swimmerZ. Early in the morning we are finding some 14-16" bass working boat docks in search of an easy meal consisting of young of the year fry. The docks with spud poles are best by far and the docks on the main lake are better than the ones in the bays. Flipping or pitching a finesse worm or fluke has been the way to go on the dock bass.

Stripes (White Bass & Yellows)

White bass are beginning to show up in decent numbers and Yellows are too. And they're mixed in with some nice cats too! Casting a **Steel Shad Blade Bait** has been our best bet on the ledges where we're finding decent schools of whites suspending off the main drops in 12-18 feet of water. Try ripping the bait off the bottom and then abruptly stop it and let it flutter to the bottom. Some of our best catches have been on the fall.

Crappie Fishing ... Mixed results number wise but really big fish. Trolling cranks is beginning to be a serious factor off the points and ledges where some big whites and blacks are being caught. This best bite seems to be best on sunny days. This is a really cool way to fish and have fun. *(Photo) Linda Hewlett from Alberta, Canada with some huge crappie*



Catfish ... catfishing is the best it's been in years for sure and on just about any live bait you want to use. A big juicy nite crawler would be my choice but a lot of the bait shops have a great assortment of catfish baits and tackle. Captain Rich has been loading the boat all week and some BIG ONES too! *(Photo) Capt'n Rich with Jimmy Pence from Paducah with Jimmy's BIG CATFISH caught fishing from the Pontoon.*

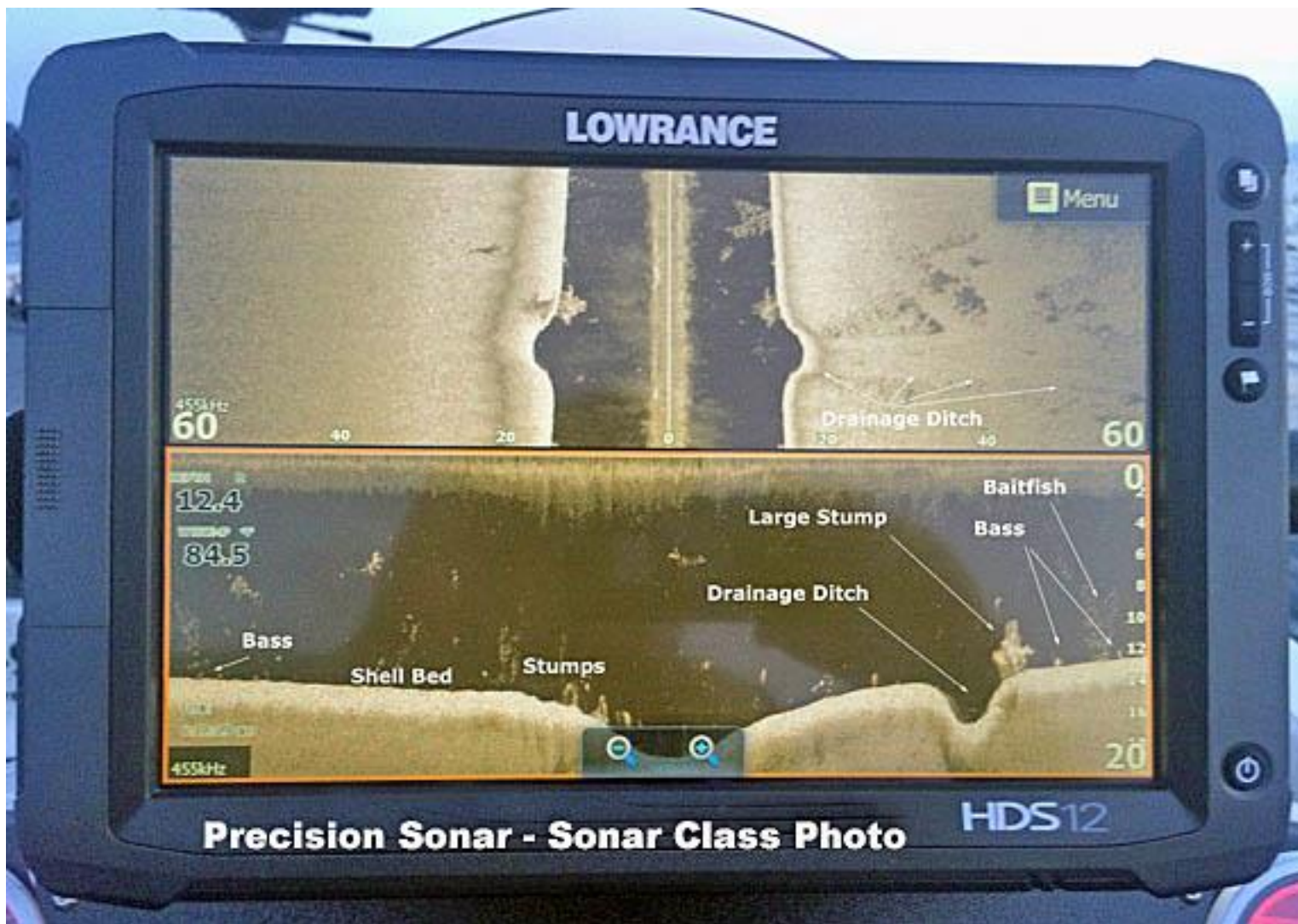
